**Why do Indonesian people say lah?** What does the suffix "lah" mean in Malay/Indonesian? As a suffix, -lah functions as kind of an imperative (telling someone to do something), for example: letakkanlah= place (it there!)

**What does dalam mean?** adjective. deep [adjective] going or being far down or far into. inside [adjective] being on or in the inside.

**What is a calabai?** Their language offers five terms referencing various combinations of sex, gender and sexuality: makkunrai ("female women"), oroani ("male men"), calalai ("female men"), calabai ("male women") and bissu ("transgender priests").

**Which island in Indonesia has 5 genders?** The Bugis are one of the four main ethnic groups of South Sulawesi, a narrow peninsular region of Sulawesi island that stretches south towards the island of Flores in the Indonesian archipelago.

**What is a calalai?** Old Bugis society in South Sulawesi recognized five gender categories: they were cis female (makkunrai), cis male (oroani), transgender female (calalai), transgender male (calabai), and bissu.
